Transition Year History

- First introduced into Schools in 1973
- Approx 70-75% of all post-primary schools offer the programme
- It is compulsory in 30% of school.
- CBS Charleville have offered and run a very successful
 TY programme for the past number of years

What is Transition Year?

- Transition Year is a one-year programme after Junior Cycle and before Senior Cycle.
- It is an extra year <u>optional</u> programme
- It acts as a bridge between Junior and Senior Cycle, by facilitating the smooth transition from the more dependent learning of the Junior Cycle to the more independent self-directed learning of the Senior Cycle

Overall aims of Transition Year:

Education for Maturity with an emphasis on social awareness and increased social competence.

Promotion of general, technical and academic **skills** with an emphasis on inter-disciplinary and self-directed learning.

Education through experience of Adult and Working life as a basis for personal development and maturity.

THE LAYERS OF THE PROGRAMME

- 1. Core Subjects are subjects that all students take for the full year.
- 2. Subject Sampling may involve giving students a taster module of the Leaving Certificate subjects available in the school to help them make informed choices when making their subject choices later. Subject sampling may also expose students to new subjects that they have not experienced before.
- 3. Transition Year Specific Layer includes subjects and modules devised both within the school and by external agencies supporting the programme in schools
- 4. TY Calendar Layer includes "once off" activities such as work experience, trips, musical production, etc.





2004)


