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


## SCIENCE WEEK AT CBS CHARLEVILLE

### HISTORY TRIP TO SPIKE ISLAND

On Tuesday, 16th of November, 2nd Year students and TY students embarked on a trip to Spike Island in Cork. Spike Island is located in the middle of the 2nd largest natural harbour on the planet, Cork Harbour. After arriving in Cobh, we took a ferry across to the island. On the way, we passed an island called Haulbowline, where the headquarters of the Irish Naval Service is located. Upon arriving on the island, we were greeted by our tour guide. He gave us some very interesting information about the history of the island. During the British occupation of Ireland, a fort was built there, called Fort Westmoreland (now called Fort Mitchel). It still stands today and takes up much of the island's land area. During the Great Famine, the island was transformed into a prison. At its peak, it held 2,300 prisoners and was the largest known prison in the world. The prison closed in 1883 but reopened in 1916. During our tour, we saw many interesting artefacts. There was a room inside the fort filled with military equipment, such as tanks, artillery, and trucks, ranging from the Medieval Era to the modern-day. We saw the 19th-century naval guns that lined the fort's walls and the other artillery pieces that dotted its grounds. There were displays of World War 1 weaponry and uniforms as well as the Irish Defence Forces' uniforms today. We toured the prison blocks and got a taste of the conditions prisoners of the 19th century had to endure. Spike Island remained as a prison up until 2004.







### LCA TRIP TO SOLAS & AHERNS NURSERIES

On Thursday 11th of November, 5th Year Leaving Certificate Applied students visited two Limerick businesses. The first business visited was Solas in Raheen. Students were given a talk by Kevin Barkley on the apprenticeship courses and programmes available in Solas and entry access options to these apprenticeships. Following the talk students were given a guided tour of the Solas facilities. Students met with apprentices and lectures to discuss courses such as welding, wet trades and carpentry. Students enjoyed exploring the various training facilities and seeing firsthand how apprentices train.

Following a lunch break, students travelled to Aherns nursery in Kilmallock. They were warmly greeted by Orla and Tim Ahern. Students were given a guided tour of the nursery facilities by Orla and she explained to students what it was like to work in the horticulture industry. Students were afforded an opportunity to participate in hands-on practical activities in the nursery. The first activity involved students trenching in bare rooted Beech, Whitethorn and Privet hedging into gravel beds for sale. The second activity was a hands-on activity on planting specimen Buxus topiary balls in borders. Students thoroughly enjoyed their day and took a lot of valuable knowledge and skills with them from the experience. ### CAREERS WEEK AT CBS CHARLEVILLE








### LEGO ROBOTICS


### IST YEAR END OF TERM AWARDS



There is a range of evidence that supports the idea that regular contact with nature can benefit a wide range of children including those on the autistic spectrum, those with emotional and behavioural difficulties and those with learning problems. This project has been years in the planning following the opening of the ASD class and our continued efforts to creating inclusive learning environments in our school.

Our sensory garden will include a number of zoned areas which will address a number of sensory needs.

- · Seedling plants & herbs to create colourful sensory zones in the new play space. This will appeal to the student's sense of sight, taste, touch & smell.
- · Sheltered seating area.
- · Water features and chimes.
- · Raised beds.
- · New pathways connecting the sensory garden to existing pathways.
- · Hexagon timber sensory surface that will include: play sand, washed pebbles, corrugated piping and barch mulch.
- · Decorative gold stone/gravel.

We are very fortunate to have such a wonderful community in Charleville to support us with this venture and I'm delighted to inform you that our groundworks were completed last week by a member of the community. Please see the pictures attached. We have a very busy few weeks ahead! Our project team has been formed which is made up of our students and they will now be able to start working on the project. # CBS CHARLEVILLE SECURES ARTIST IN RESIDENCE






### CHARLEVILLE CBS JOINS 12,000 TY STUDENTS NATIONWIDE CELEBRATING #THINKLANGUAGES 2021

Now in its fourth year, the Languages Connect flagship event has grown in popularity and there are more than double the number of schools taking part in 2021 compared to last year's event. With the new localised school format introduced last year, #ThinkLanguages is now held nationally with students and their teachers asked to 'Think Global, Act Local' and explore the languages spoken by those in their school and local community, as well as further afield. 
### TY LAW WORKSHOP
